

whistle-blowing. Plaintiff only began going to the authorities and attempting to whistle-blow once he knew he was being investigated for sexual harassment. Plaintiff was terminated solely for sexual harassing five women and not for whistle-blowing. Plaintiff was fired after the interviewing of 60 employees regarding the sexual harassment charges which included unwanted touching, blocked hallways and doorways, sexually explicit stories of the Plaintiff's sexual activities and unwelcome solicitations.

INJURIES: Emotional distress.

Treatment: Psychiatric.

DAMAGES: \$2,600,000 future medical and future loss of earnings.

DEMAND: \$500,000

VERDICT

\$788,000 total; \$751,000 economic and \$37,000 non-economic
